- Parents do not have support networks, especially lone parents
- Families can't afford the basics, every day is a struggle
- Children do not have everything they need to feel safe at home, confident at school or to thrive in childhood.

- **Empowered Parents**: Parents gain confidence, make positive life changes, acquire necessary skills, and alleviate financial pressures.
- **Thriving Children**: Children are confident at school, have safe sleeping environments, experience comfortable early childhoods, and access opportunities to thrive.
- Reduced Need for Statutory Intervention and charitable support: Prevent families and children from requiring statutory or charitable intervention through early and preventative support.
- **Families are part of strong networks in supportive communities:** Give families, and the wider communities opportunities to connect and grow good support networks.

Our Activities

- **Family Support Services**: Provide comprehensive support to families with complex needs through coaching, peer support, emotional assistance, signposting, advocacy, and specialist services.
- **Increased Access to Essential Items**: Offer low-cost essential items and a digital platform for information sharing and self-help to a wider range of families.
- **Build Community:** Create opportunities for parents to meet and support one another and create opportunities for the wider community to join together to support one another.
